

Professional Dress Code for Projects

Before you begin packing for your project, please keep in mind Medical Ministry International's *Professional Dress Code for Projects*. Please remember that a main focus of the project is to be a Christian witness to the people we will serve, while being sensitive to the local culture. Any country-specific variations to this dress code will be communicated to project teams two weeks prior to departure. This dress code will be reiterated during orientation at the beginning of each project when you arrive in country. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Hospital/Clinic Setting:

Following these guidelines helps our teams to demonstrate professionalism in the hospital/clinic setting.

- Long pants, capris or knee-length skirts are required at all times.
- Scrubs are appropriate.
- If working in a hospital setting, scrubs cannot be worn to and from the hospital. Change rooms will be available.

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Free Time/Weekend Excursions:

These guidelines help our teams to demonstrate respect for local culture when outside the hospital/clinic.

- Knee-length shorts should only be worn on scheduled tourist days, at the discretion of the Project Director.
- Short-shorts and revealing tops (thin straps or midriff-baring) are not appropriate at any time, even in hot climates. Please do not pack them.
- Swimming attire is appropriate only at swimming locations.
